General hand sanitiser posters to be placed in any area required (office/kitchen/entrance/exit). Posters can be rotated from time to time. It is recommended to have each poster laminated as they would be placed in wet areas.

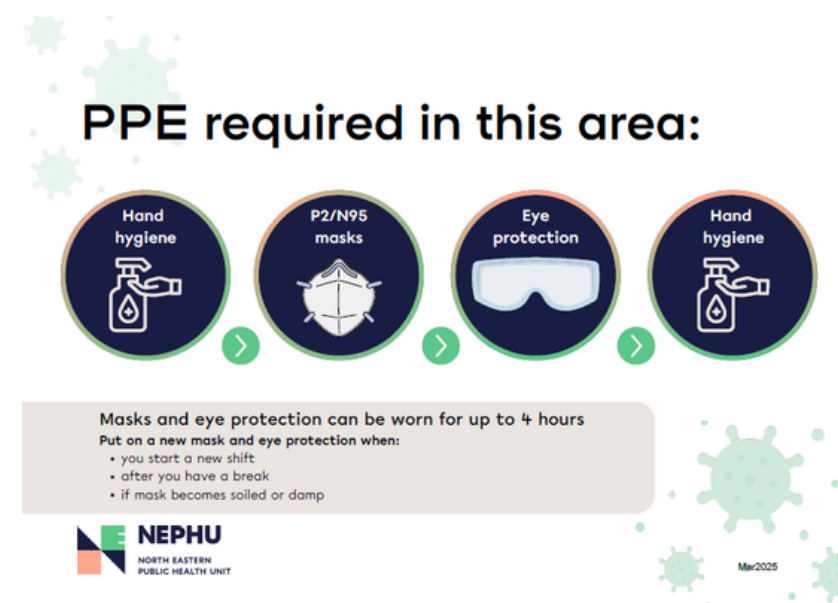
Respiratory outbreaks

Respiratory 130425



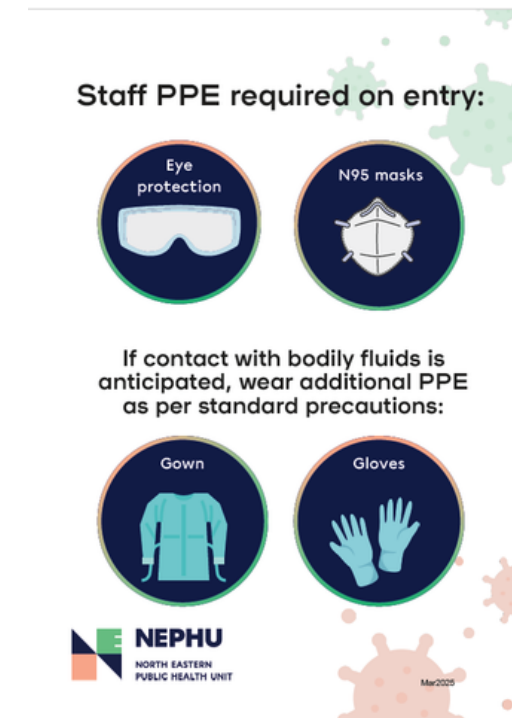

To be used at entry to locations where respiratory PPE may be required. This may only be required at certain times of outbreak/changes in industry procedures.

To be used at entry to locations where PPE may be required

Signage_PPE Doffing 030425



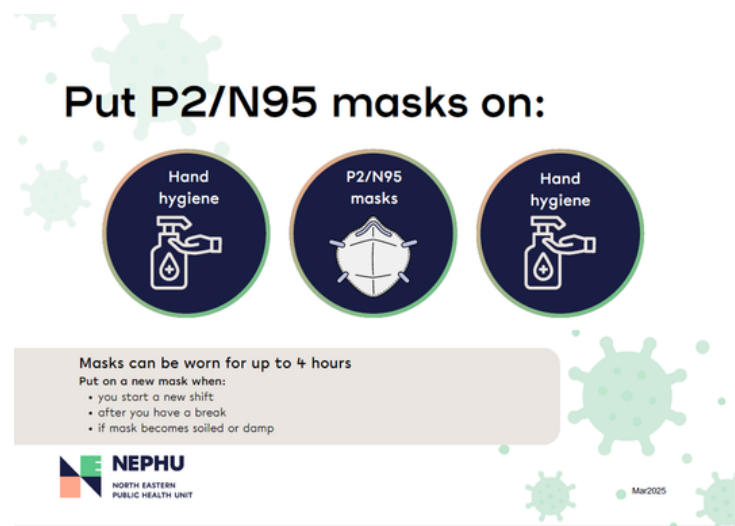
To be placed near doffing stations (near bins) to guide and remind staff of the correct doffing process and sequence

Poster can be taken down once locations in the facility no longer require respiratory PPE.

To be placed in locations as a reminder for staff entering areas where N95 masks are required. Poster can be taken down once locations in the facility no longer require staff to put on N95 masks.

To be placed in staff or public areas where masks are required for entrance.

To be placed near doffing stations (near bins) to show correct mask removal process and sequence for public and staff to follow.

When an outbreak has been identified, the poster needs to be placed at entrances/exits to inform visitors of current cases/outbreak (gastro or respiratory). QR codes lead to relevant information on the Better Health Channel.

Once the respective outbreak has been officially stood down, the poster can be taken down.
